What prompted her to open a gallery in Carmel? Constance said that “I want to make my art more accessible to customers on the northside. The parking is great and they can easily visit my studio to see what I create.” She feels that the designers with whom she works will also like the convenience. In addition Constance wants “to introduce myself to younger families.” Over the years much of her work has been devoted to portraying children of all ages and with her move she hopes to find even more.
